

# Medicare Open Enrollment ready for seniors to choose new health, drug plans



Every year, Medicare's open enrollment period is <u>October 15</u> through <u>December 7</u>.

Nov. 2, 2016 - Medicare health and drug plans can make changes each year - things like cost, coverage, and what providers and pharmacies are in their networks. October 15 to December 7 is when all people with Medicare can change their Medicare health plans and prescription drug coverage for the following year to better meet their needs.

#### How do people know if they need to change plans?

People in a Medicare health or prescription drug plan should always review the materials their plans send them, like the "Evidence of Coverage" (EOC) and "Annual Notice of Change" (ANOC). If their plans are changing, they should make sure their plans will still meet their needs for the following year. If they're satisfied that their current plans will meet their needs for next year and it's still being offered, they don't need to do anything.

### When can people get information about next year's Medicare plans?

Information for next year's plans was available beginning in October.

### My Favorite Recipe Issue 117, December 2016

### Holiday Appetizer Wreath



#### **Ingredients**

#### 6 slices bacon

1/2 cup chive-and-onion cream cheese spread (from 8-oz container)

2 cans (8 oz each) Pillsbury™ refrigerated crescent dinner rolls

2 cups frozen broccoli florets (from 14oz bag), thawed, finely chopped and patted dry with paper towel

1/3 cup diced red bell pepper

I egg, beaten

I teaspoon sesame seed Fresh rosemary, if desired

#### Preparation

I Heat oven to 375°F. Cook bacon as desired until crisp. Drain on paper towel; crumble bacon and set aside.

2 Unroll both cans of dough; separate into 16 triangles. On ungreased large cookie sheet, arrange triangles with shortest sides toward center, overlapping in wreath shape and leaving 4-inch round circle open in center (see diagram). Crescent dough points may overlap edge of cookie sheet. Press overlapping dough to flatten.

3 Spread cream cheese spread on dough to within I inch of points. In small bowl, mix crumbled bacon, broccoli and bell pepper; spoon onto widest part of dough. Pull end points of triangles over broccoli mixture and tuck under dough to form ring (filling will be visible). Carefully brush dough with beaten egg; sprinkle with sesame seed.

4 Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until deep golden brown. Cool 5 minutes. With broad spatula, carefully loosen wreath from cookie sheet; slide onto serving platter. Garnish with fresh rosemary. Serve warm.

#### Craft: Art Work

You will need a flat canvas, sharpie, and multiple colors of paint.

Begin by drawing your light strand. As guests arrive have them initial a spot. Next have them place a painted thumb print of their color choice along the line but not on it. Allow paint to dry, then you may draw squiggly lines from strand of lights to the thumb print to resemble a bulb on the strand.

Finalize craft my adding a personal saying and the year in which it was made so you may remember who all was there for the holiday that year.

Our In-Home Personal Care Programs provide hands-on services to those whom are medically and financially eligible. Determination of eligibility is based on the completion of a medical assessment. Once guidelines are reviewed and eligibility is determined, the client will be provided with a personal care provider.

Our staff is dedicated to our clients' well-being and to keeping them healthy and in their home for as long as possible. Aides are trained in CPR, and First Aid, and it is mandatory that our caregivers attend classes for continuing health education.

In addition, all our aides receive a state-to-state background check and fingerprinting check.

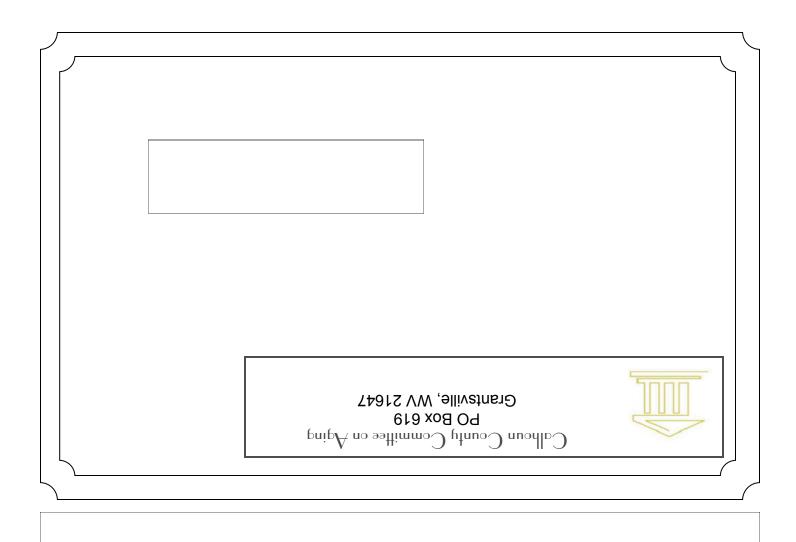
