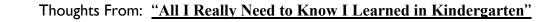

#### **CCCOA Grievance Procedures**

Some CCCOA staff and Board of Directors members have received "anonymous" letters over the past months expressing numerous matters or concerns, mostly reflecting or based upon incorrect or inaccurate assumptions. While the identity of the writer is substantially certain, it is still not possible to "officially" respond to correspondence lacking return addresses or signed with fake identities, which then leaves the incorrect or inaccurate statements unaddressed.

After consultation with the Commissioner of the West Virginia Bureau of Senior Services about the matter and learning more about the Bureau's policy regarding anonymous communications and of maintaining means of being open to legitimate complaints or concerns, it has been determined that CCCOA will maintain a similar practice and will discard and ignore any further anonymous communications, but certainly will remain open to and receptive of legitimate concerns or complaints regarding CCCOA services that are presented via the established Grievance Procedures, which exist to provide a means for any complaints or concerns to be fully considered and resolved in a method that is respectful and fair to all parties involved.

And, of course, any suggestions or observations about ways CCCOA can improve services (or provide them more efficiently) are always welcome and appreciated . . . we want CCCOA to be a great place to be!

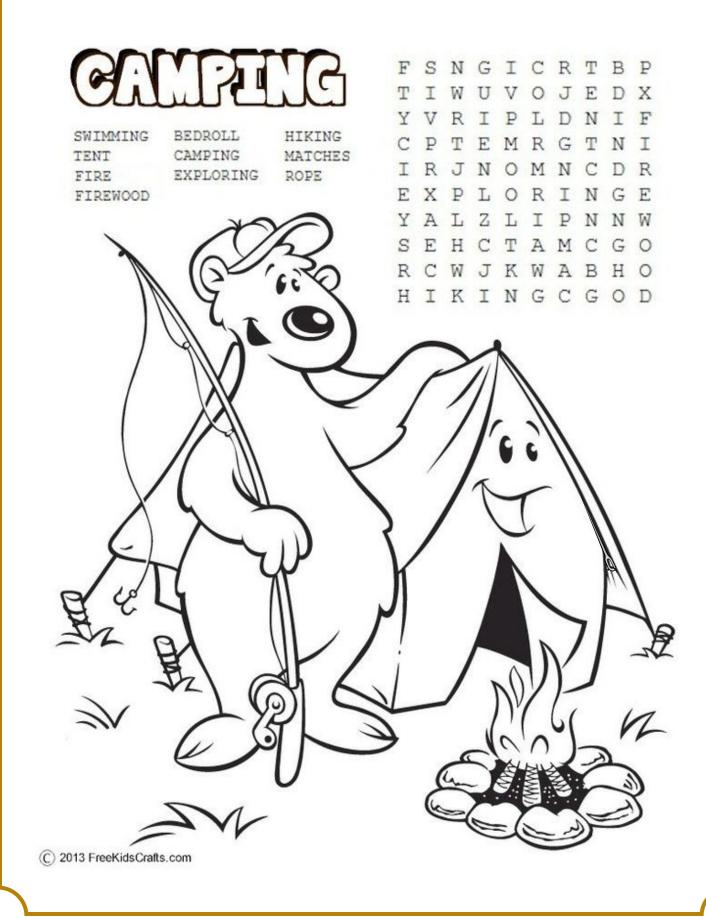
Our In-Home Personal Care Programs provide hands-on services to those whom are medically and financially eligible. Determination of eligibility is based on the completion of a medical assessment. Once guidelines are reviewed and eligibility is determined, the client will be provided with a personal care provider.

Our staff is dedicated to our clients' well-being and to keeping them healthy and in their home for as long as possible. Aides are trained in CPR, and First Aid, and it is mandatory that our caregivers attend classes for continuing health education.

In addition, all our aides receive a state-to-state background check and fingerprinting check.

If you or a friend or loved one are in need of services, please give us a call. We are here to be at your service. Do not hesitate to ask questions about eligibility or guidelines.
