



# Mozzarella Stuffed Meatballs

These mozzarella stuffed meatballs are a fun twist on the classic recipe - serve these meatballs as a party appetizer or over a big plate of spaghetti for a hearty meal!

Ingredients:

- 1 and <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pounds ground beef (85-90% lean) <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup breadcrumbs
- 1 teaspoon salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon pepper
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon garlic powder
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 egg
- 2 tablespoons water
- 6 ounces mozzarella cheese, cut into  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch cubes
- 3 cups marinara sauce (homemade or store bought), warmed
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- cooking spray

Instructions:

Preheat the broiler. Line a sheet pan with foil and coat the foil with cooking spray.

Place the beef, breadcrumbs, salt, pepper, garlic powder, oregano, egg and water in a bowl; mix until

thoroughly combined. You may need to add more water, 1 tablespoon at a time, to get a smooth mixture.

Take approximately 2 tablespoons of the meat mixture and roll it into a ball. Press a cube of cheese into the ball of meat, making sure that the meat completely surrounds the cheese. Place the meatball on the sheet pan and repeat with remaining meat and cheese. Spray the tops of the meatballs with cooking spray. Broil for 10 minutes or until meatballs are just done - do not overcook or the cheese filling may start to spill out.

Place the meatballs on a plate and pour the marinara sauce over the top, Sprinkle with parsley and serve immediately.

The amount may be so small that you can't even see it. This can happen when you touch objects, food or drinks contaminated by feces or stool from an infected person.




